MAP test scores are good news for D181

Spring MAP test scores show Community Consolidated Elementary District 181 students are continuing to outperform their peers, with most showing a higher than expected level of growth.

Thirty-four percent of students scored in the 90-99th percentile on the Measurement of Academic Progress in reading, with almost 60 percent scoring in the top decile in math, Kristin Reingruber told board members at their June 17 meeting. Seventy-two percent scored in the top three decile bands (70-79, 80-89 and 90-99) in reading and 83 percent did so in math. Reingruber, the district's director of assessment, instruction and evaluation, shared slides showing student's performance in the various decile bands. No bell curves were to be seen.

"We do not see the typical curve that you do see across other districts," she said. "I had to make the graph smaller and slide it over a little bit."

All but three grades at all nine schools exceeded the 50 percent growth target in reading.

"Across the board we are significantly above or right at that number," Reingruber said. "These are really exciting numbers to see."

Walker first-graders showed the highest percentage growth at 84.3.

Madison third-graders, Monroe fifth-graders and Hinsdale Middle School sixth-graders fell below the 50 percent benchmark, showing 45.3 to 46.5 percent growth.

In math, all but two grades saw more than 50 percent growth. Walker first-graders again showed the most at 96.1 percent, with 16 grades showing growth of 80 percent or more. Madison fifth-graders and HMS sixth-graders showed 49.2 and 46.9 percent growth, respectively.

Board member Grace Shin noted that the district purchased a new math curriculum two years ago.

"I think we're seeing the fruits of those results right now," Shin said. Principals presented their school improvement plans to academic success committee members earlier in the day June 17.

"Our teams are going to continue to reflect on both the academic and the social-emotional strategies. Their goal is to be intentional to meet the needs of all their learners," Reingruber said.

Board member Margie Kleber offered her congratulations to the department of learning.

"This is amazing. Every year I'm blown away," she said.

"I love the fact that we continue to push that bar higher and higher," Superintendent Hector Garcia commented. "What a great way to end the year."



Monday market starts the week off right

From berries to baked goods, stands offer delicious treats to tempt the summer palate

The weekly farmer's market on Chicago Avenue between Garfield and Washington streets has been part of Hinsdale for 48 years, and Rob Pondelick's family has been present for every one of them.

Pondelick is the fifth-generation owner of Theis Farm Market in Maple Park, one of several farm-based businesses in Pondelick's family and one of two produce-producing farms to participate in the Monday market offered by the Hinsdale Chamber of Commerce.

"For a Monday morning, it's not too bad," Pondelick said of the crowd seeking his stand's fresh fruits and vegetables. Speaking from years of experience, Pondelick expects the crowds to get even bigger after the Fourth of July, when the variety of produce expands.

"That's when it really gets poppin,' " he said.

Pondelick rises at about 3 a.m. each Monday to prepare for the hour-long trip to Hinsdale. It's one of five markets on his weekly schedule.

While Pondelick is traveling east, the folks from Kugel Farms of Berrien Springs,

Mich., are making their way around Lake Michigan in time for the market's 7 a.m. start.

The Kugel Farms stand is a favorite on Laila Alamuddin's weekly outing to the Hinsdale market. She said she's been visiting the market since 2011 to stock up on homegrown, fresh food. That includes eggs and meat from Farmer Nick's. "We love it," she said.

On this particular Monday, Alamuddin stocked up on fresh berries for smoothies and ingredients for a gathering she had planned for later in the week.

While Alamuddin comes to the market for healthy food she can make herself, vendor Maple & Yam offers up prepared dishes made with those same simple, healthy ingredients. Married couple Bob Lewandowski and Diana Luna of Clarendon Hills began the business just seven months ago, naming it after one of their most popular creations - yams seasoned with real Vermont maple syrup. It, along with barbecue meatballs, pot roast sliders and breakfast sandwiches made with organic eggs, is hot and ready to go every Monday.

Lewandowski said he spends about eight hours a day cooking the food he sells at area markets each week. He uses ingredients like grass-fed beef, organic eggs, fresh vegetables and real butter.

"We want to stay true to the 'farm-to-table,' " and support local farmers, Luna said.

Located next to Burlington Park, the market offers plenty of room for people to gather for a chat or relax with a treat from one of the market's nine food trucks. That's where 10-year-old Sloan Allegretti chose to enjoy her acai bowl from Bao Acai.

"There's always a new stand," said Sloan, who called her first acai bowl "awesome." Sloan's mother, Barbie, said the market is a great way to spend a summer morning with

her children.

"It's a nice family outing," she said, and a chance for her daughters to try new foods and fresh, seasonal produce. Sloan said she's looking forward to enjoying the peaches, plums and nectarines she remembers from last year's offerings.

Among the market's nearly 30 vendors are bakeries with freshly made treats and local businesses selling products from home improvements to houseplants. New to the market this summer is Hestia Grinds, a brother-sister team bringing signature-blend coffees to the market. Samuel and Alex Cardenas said they work

with family farms all over the world to create their brand's unique flavors. Shoppers can grab a cup of cold or hot brew, a bag of whole or ground beans or even a growler or cans of coffee to go.

The market continues every Monday from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. through Oct. 14. New, seasonal items will become available throughout summer and into fall.

Parking deck work closes some spaces

Phase 1 work began this week on the Hinsdale parking deck, resulting in partial closures of the upper and lower parking deck.

The parking stalls and drive lane on the south side of both levels of the parking deck (closest to Hinsdale Middle School) will be closed while maintenance is being performed.

Parking will be available in the middle and northernmost lanes of both levels. Purple permit holders should park in the purple zone on Hinsdale Avenue between Grant and Clay streets. Overflow parking is also available in the Washington lot and in red permit spaces on Washington, Lincoln, Second and Third streets.

Phase 1 of the preventive maintenance work is expected to take two weeks. It includes re-caulking joints between the precast tees and control joint maintenance, according to George Peluso, director of public services and engineering for the village.

Phases 2 and 3 will involve completing the same work in the center and northern portions of the parking deck. All work is expected to be completed by late July or early August, depending on weather, Peluso said.

Updates about construction activity will be posted on the village's website at www. villageofhinsdale.org.

Police enforcement to increase before July 4

The Hinsdale Police Department has is stepping up Fourth of July traffic enforcement with a focus on impaired and unbuckled driver through the early-morning hours of July 8.

"It's a straightforward message: If you're behind the wheel, stay sober. Don't drink, use marijuana, or consume any other impairing substances before or when driving," said Deputy Chief Thomas Lillie.

Follow these tips to help ensure a happy and safe holiday:

• Designate a sober driver and give them your keys

before you go out.

• Don't let friends or family members drive under the influence.


• If you are drunk or impaired by marijuana or

other drugs, call a taxi, take mass transit, use your favorite ride-sharing app or call a sober friend or family member to get you home safely.

• Promptly report drunken drivers to law enforcement by pulling over and dialing 911.

• Make sure everyone in the vehicle wears their seat belt. It's not only the law, but also your best defense against an impaired driver.

The statewide "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over," "Drive High Get a DUI" and "Click It or Ticket" programs are made possible by federal highway safety funds administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation. The enforcement period runs concurrently with IDOT's media campaign, reminding motorists that "It's Not a Game" to drive impaired.

Woman finds community service outlet in Juniors

Shortly after moving to Hinsdale from Chicago in 2021, Hinsdale's Alex LaRoia signed up for a baby music class hoping to enrich the bond with her child.

She had no idea the extent to which her personal connections also would flourish.

"I met some girls who were in (Hinsdale Junior Woman's Club), and that opened up the floodgates to my entryway to the club," LaRoia said.

Leadership posts in Juniors followed, first as new member chair and currently as one of the philanthropy co-chairs of the community service-oriented group, leveraging her background in social work.

"We oversee the entire grant-making process and our service projects," said LaRoia, who is able to lean into her social work background. "It felt like a natural fit to take on this role."

She's been busy recently helping coordinate the "Sunsets in Santorini"themed summer party benefit on July 20 (see Page 18 for details). All of the ticket proceeds will be used to support worthy agencies, she said.

Miss Illinois will even make an appearance to advocate for Bernie's Book Bank, promoing literacy among under-resourced youth, and guests are invited to bring a children's book to donate.

"It's a nice nod to what the club is about: community and philanthropy," LaRoia said. Organizers have also

Organizers have also planned an homage to mark Juniors' 75th year, with artifacts including cookbooks early members compiled as a fundraiser.

"It's a real way to honor the legacy of the club and also to light the path to where we're going in the future," she said. "The reason why it started in 1949 was not only to enrich the lives of the community but to give back."

The gatherings the group holds may seem social in nature, LaRoia acknowledged, but they are parties with a purpose.

"We are raising a lot of money to give away to people," she said. "Last year we raised over \$300,000 and gave it to 21 different organizations and (awarded) four different scholarships."

LaRoia, who works for a family-owned natural stone firm, recounted the challenge of securing a home during the crazy market during the pandemic.

"We had to write a letter and put our family photo in the letter," she recounted. "It was like, 'Pick me!'"

LaRoia and her family like to travel when time permits, and she looks forward to walking her oldest to school in the fall when he starts kindergarten.

"I feel very blessed to be here," she said. "Hinsdale feels very idyllic. We're just trying to give our kids that good old-fashioned child-hood."

And it's worked out well for the parents, too.

"We've met so many people through the club, so many like-minded people and young families," LaRoia said. "Now I know so many more people at the grocery store and in town because of the club. It's been a critical part of my transition from the city."

Helping carry on the tradition of Hinsdale Junior Woman's Club has been an unexpected reward to making the village their home.

Keep your cool when temperatures get extreme

The milder temperatures this week are welcome relief from the recent stretch of steamy weather. But as veteran Chicago-area denizens know, summer days can become scorchers in a hurry, posing health hazards if not taken seriously, particularly to children, seniors, those with special needs and pets.

In addition to discomfort and fatigue, high temperatures can cause heat-related health issues such as heat cramps, heat exhaustion and heat stroke. To protect yourself and others, the Illinois Department of Public Health offers these guidelines when the mercury's on the rise.

• Use a buddy system.

If you are at home and are 65 years of age or older or have a chronic health problem, ask a friend, relative or neighbor check on you at least twice a day, even if you have air conditioning. If you know someone who is 65 years of age or older or who has a chronic health problem, check on them at least twice a day.

• Limit outdoor activities.

Try to plan activities for the coolest times of the day — before noon and in the evening. When physically active, rest frequently in the shade.

• Drink plenty of fluids.

During hot weather, you will need to drink more liquid than your thirst indicates. Even if you remain indoors and limit your activity, your body still needs to replace lost fluids, salt and minerals. Make an effort to drink a minimum of six to eight 8-ounce glasses of cool fluids daily. During heavy exercise in a hot environment, drink two to four glasses of cool fluids each hour. Parents should be sure young children get sufficient fluids. Avoid alcoholic beverages and those containing caffeine. Salt tablets are not substitutes for fluids.

• Protect your body.

Wear as little clothing as possible when indoors, and wear light-colored, loose-fitting clothing outdoors. When spending time outdoors, avoid direct sunlight, wear a hat and use sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF)

greater than 15 to protect yourself against sunburn.

Never leave children, the elderly or pets in a parked car. The air temperature inside a car rises rapidly during hot weather and can lead to brain damage or death in just a few minutes.
Take care of your pets.

In many ways, dogs and cats react to hot weather as humans do. Offer pets extra water and be sure to place the water dish in a shaded area if outdoors. Make sure pets have a protected place where they can get away from the sun.

• Watch for symptoms of heat exhaustion.

Dizziness, headache, nausea, abdominal cramps, shallow breathing, cool and clammy skin, muscle tremors and heavy perspiration can be signs of heat exhaustion. A person exhibiting such symptoms should be moved to an air-conditioned environment or a shady spot. Loosen their clothing and have them drink water or another non-alcoholic cool beverage. Seek medical attention if symptoms worsen or last longer than one hour.

A lot of Facebook posts will tell you what books you should be reading right now.

I tend to look at these posts the same way I used to look at summer reading lists when I was in high school. I wanted to read all of the books so I could be as prepared as possible for the first day of school. But I'm not in school anymore, and so I don't have to be tortured with the incomprehensible prose of William's Faulkner's "Light in August."

Nor do I have to find regionally appropriate books to read while on vacation. John Irving's bizarre novel "The Hotel New Hampshire" cured me of that desire.

And yet I still collect screenshots of Facebook posts, such as one suggesting "48 Books to Read in 2024." I don't want to think about people who don't like me or things I don't know or read travel stories about depressing journeys when it's 85 and sunny outside. Another post, which

suggests reading a more manageable 15 books in 2024, also is too heavily focused on self-improvement, with titles like "The Art of Thinking Clearly," "Atomic Habits"

and "How to Finish Everything You Start." No thank you — unless what

you're looking to finish is a frozen drink or elaborate sand castle on the beach.

What do I like to read in the summer? Light, happy books that make me smile and laugh or that introduce me to new places.

And what might those books be? So glad you asked.

• "Remarkably Bright Creatures" by Shelby Van Pelt

This story of a friendship between an octopus and an older, widowed woman is filled with surprises, including first-person reflections from Marcellus (the octopus) that are especially wonderful if you listen to the book instead of reading it. • "West With the

Giraffes" by Lynda Rutledge

This novel was inspired by the true story of two giraffes who made headlines traveling from New York to the San Diego Zoo in 1938. Rutledge's

writing not only takes you across the country, it takes you back to an America (of Tin Lizzies and Dapper Dan pomade and Burma-Shave cream) that is long gone.

• anything by Jane Austen

People — at least those who weren't English majors — tend to think 18th-century literature is serious and should be avoided at all costs. Jane Austen wrote romances, albeit with very long sentences, which make for perfect summer reads. Once you get used to the cadence of those very long sen-

tences, you'll be enchanted. • "The Secret Life of Bees" by Sue Monk Kidd

While its subject matter is a little heavier than some of the other books on this list, I found this novel about healing and self-discovery to be touching and inspirational.

• "Little House on the Prairie" by Laura Ingalls Wilder

I have such wonderful memories of reading all the "Little House" books when I was a kid and later watching the TV series with my parents. Life was not particularly easy on the prairie, but there's something to be said for the simplicity of the time and the joy of receiving a tin cup, a penny and a piece of candy for Christmas.

• "Eat, Pray, Love" by Elizabeth Gilbert

"Dispose Of" piles.



The Illinois Secretary of State's office is dedicating DMV services exclusively for teen drivers every Saturday during the summer at select facilities, Secretary Alexi Giannoulias announced earlier this month.

The Teen Summer DMV initiative, which includes opening 12 additional DMVs on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. June 1 to Aug. 31, will cater exclusively to helping teens get their drivers licenses or permits quickly and conveniently. The effort is part of Giannoulias' modernization plan to create efficiencies and reduce wait times.

"Teen-only DMVs provide working parents, who can't take time off work during the week to shuttle their child to a DMV, a convenient weekend option where they can make an appointment without waiting," he said. "Getting your first driver's license is an exciting milestone, and we want to ensure the experience is as easy as possible for Illinois teens and their parents." Teen service hours will be offered at the following locations: Addison, Aurora, Bethalto, Belvidere, Bridgeview, Chicago West; Des Plaines, Elgin, Joliet, Lake Zurich, Plano and St. Charles. State law requires teen

drivers and a parent or guardian to visit a DMV in person to complete testing and identity verification prior to receiving their first drivers license. Parents and teens can call (800) 252-8980 to schedule an appointment at any of the 12 DMV locations.

In addition to the Teen Summer DMVs, 15 other DMVs operate on Saturdays, including two of the largest facilities in the state located on the North and South sides of Chicago. Teens are welcome to make appointments at those facilities on Saturdays as well.

Teen drivers interested in obtaining their first license will be scheduled for 10-minute appointments if they have already completed the required behind-the-wheel driving tests through their high school or commercial driving facility. If they need to complete a driving test at a DMV, they will be scheduled for a 30-minute appointment. Teens who need driving permits can also schedule an appointment to take a written test.

Any unfilled appointments during teen service hours will become available to the general public at 7 a.m.

New drivers will need to bring the following to the DMV:

• their logbook for their instructional permit

their blue and white road test waiver form from their high school if they have one
their birth certificate

• their physical Social Security card

• two proofs of address forms, such as school transcripts or a parent's drivers license or ID card



Undefeated postseason yields title

Hinsdale Herd U10 outscores opponents 37-18 in state series, win championship

The Hinsdale Herd U10 Black lacrosse team, with a 5-3 regular season record, went 6-0 in the post-season to become the Illinois Youth Lacrosse League state champions June 2 at Barrington High School.

Parent coach Brendan Goss said his expectations at the start of the season in mid-April did not include a state title for the then thirdgrade boys.

"We knew we had some good players. Truthfully, we never worried about wins or losses. We only cared about their effort," said Goss, who coaches the team with dad Todd Osterman and Hinsdale Herd coach Harry Meredith. The team's three losses — all to fourth-grade teams — were some of the most impressive in terms of effort, Goss said. And the boys continued to improve as the season went on.

"There are some kids, I think this is the first year they played, and they became some of our major contributors," he said. "It truly was awesome to see. It was shocking to see the improvement of almost everyone."

Dan Applebaum of East Avenue Lacrosse, who launched the Hinsdale Herd program in 2021, said he has coached a handful of this team's members since they started playing.

"It's a special group," he said. "They have a lot of fun playing together. They all seem to be really good friends off the field as well, the parents included.

"It was awesome to see them play not just good lacrosse, but high-level lacrosse for that age, making smart plays, being pretty skilled for that age and ultimately having a lot of fun doing it," he added.

The most challenging game of the post-season was the state semifinals against the Lake Villa Timberwolves.

"We were down by two with two minutes left," said Luke Schroeder, who plays defense and is one of the seven players from Hinsdale on the 14-member team. "We won by one with 15 seconds left."

The boys improved on that 10-9 win by taking the Palatine Jr. Vikings Yellow team 10-3 in the championship contest. Six different players scored in that game.

"I think we all did good and knew when to pass," said Brant Derry, who plays mostly midfield.

"We're the best fourthgrade team now," Riggan Cuculich, who plays attack and midfield, said.

The 9-year-olds, who all play multiple sports, have anywhere from two to six years of experience playing lacrosse. They attribute their success to working together, sharing the ball, paying attention at practice and being friends as well as teammates. They also acknowledge the game can be challenging.

Alex Crist said playing goalie comes with a lot of pressure to prevent the other team from scoring. "It can be very hard depending on what kind of shot it is," he said, citing the bounce shot as the most difficult. "When it bounces, you have no idea where it is going to turn."

But mostly they have a lot of fun — and they enjoy the physical aspects of the game.

"My favorite thing is either hitting guys or winning games," Tucker Armstrong, who plays defense, said.

Creating an environment in which players have fun is one of the program's goals, Applebaum said.

"That's much more important than wins and losses or individual accolades," he said. "It's about developing a passion for the game and the relationships that you make on that path."
